The Free State is home to some impressive geological features. In the Northern Free State, the Vredefort Dome is the world's oldest and largest meteor impact site and is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Further south, in the Eastern Free State, there are the geological wonders of The Sentinel which lies at the northernmost point of the Drakensberg Mountains. The Sentinel trail takes hikers 3.000 meters above the Drakensberg Amphitheatre, offering spectacular views.

The geology of the Golden Gate **Highlands National Park** is fascinating and were formed during the Late Triassic Epoch and the Jurassic Period (roughly 150 to 230 million years ago). Golden Gate has three distinct geological layers that can be clearly seen in the Brandwag Rock (the much photographed sandstone outcrop that stands sentinel over the park). Geologists read rock formations from the bottom up. At the bottom is the red mudstone, called the Elliot Formation. which contains fossils of the Massospondylus, the dinosaur species that once roamed the area. Above the Elliot layer is the Clarens Formation, which is the cream sandstone layer consisting of dune sand from when the region was a desert some 190 million years ago. The top layer is black and studded with crystals. This is the Drakensberg Formation and comprises of the lava flow from the volcanic eruptions of over 100 million years ago.

There are some exciting dinosaur fossil sites in the Clarens area, dating back around 240 million years. The fossils discovered show how sizes varied

amongst dinosaurs. For example, the Massospondylus was about 5m-6m long; while the Lesothosaurus was only about 90cm long. In 2018, fossils of a new species, Ledumahadi Mafube were discovered just outside Clarens, astounding the palaeontology community.

Dinosaur enthusiasts can learn more about the pre-historic life that existed in the area by joining Dr Gideon Groenewald from Clarens Dinosaur on a dinosaur hunting expedition – bookings are essential – 072 335 8768. A visit to **Mafube Mountain Retreat,** near Fouriesburg to view very well preserved dinosaur footprints is also a must – bookings essential – 084 668 4499.

Unfortunately, at this of going to print, the Dinosaur Museum in the Golden Gate Highlands National Park is still not open. Keep an eye on our Facebook page and Instagram account for more information. Every buttress, outcrop, cave and holkrans (overhang) that catches your eye while exploring our region has a story that predates man. We just need to learn how to read it.





he Eastern Free State offers some of the best fishing waters in South Africa. Fly-fishing is the most popular, with wild trout in rivers and streams, and a few well stocked bass and trout dams at private venues. The

season usually opens on 1st September and closes on

31st May to allow for spawning, and all venues work on a catch and release hasis

Fishing venues include:

The Little Caledon River. for wild rainbow trout and yellowfish. A natural river depending on rainfall, the Little Caledon is not always fishable. Access can be obtained from De

Molen Farm on the R712.

The Kloof dam at the Clarens Village Conservancy is a public venue where one can find large-mouth bass and grass carp. Permits are for sale at different venues around town or from their website -

www.clarensvillageconserva ncy.com. At only R40, the permits are valid for a week from date of purchase and help raise funds for conservation and maintenance in the Clarens Nature Reserve.

The Ash River, for wild rainbow and brown trout. This is a man-made

> river, bringing water from Katse Dam in Lesotho

> > through an 82km tunnel. The waters

> > > have a constant low temperature and are deep and fast, making it quite challenging to fish. Access is limited and can, at time of print, only be gained through Mavungana **Flyfishing**

(Nathan - 071 687 1707).

The Fouriesburg Town Dam allows fishing. A key for the gate situated next to the Farmers Association Hall is available from Di

Plaasstoep Restaurant (R100 refundable deposit for the key).

Emden Farm, 15km outside Fouriesburg, offers 3 beautiful dams, well stocked with large-mouth bass. Day visitors are welcome and do not need to stay on the farm. Contact Duncan Long on 0823344591.







For guided fishing trips in and around Fouriesburg and Clarens, contact Greg at **Clarens Fishing** on 073 428 478 – booking in advance is a must.


Sol Plaatjies Dam (previously Saulspoort Dam), outside Bethlehem, is open to the public. There are 2 slipways to launch boats from. It is home to yellowfish, carp and bass.

There are a few private fishing venues around the region where one need to stay at their accommodation to be able to fish the dams or rivers. For trout, contact **Sediba Lodge** (058 256 1028), **Royal Coachman** (082 824 9365) or **Kingsbrook Pods** (082 926 4068).

For large-mouth bass, contact **Boulders Lodge** (082 806 9612), **Boschoek Bass Cottage** (083 581 1627) or **Welgelegen Cherry Farm** (072 075 0760). For yellowfish, contact **Mafube Mountain Retreat** (084 668 4499). **Loch Athlone** on the R26 just outside Bethlehem also offers fishing to its guests (082 927 0209).

For the more adventurous anglers, **Sterkfontein Dam** is only 60km from Clarens and is open to the public. The crystalclear waters are home to yellowfish (the Sterkfontein Gold) carp, bass and catfish. Bank fishing is popular with anglers and fly-fishermen alike. There are also numerous launching facilities for boats, but beware as the Sterkfontein Dam is known for strong winds and large waves. To experience Sterkfontein Dam at its best, contact Jeremy Rochester

from Escape Flyfishing on 083 607 6109.





he closest crossing into Lesotho from Fouriesburg and Clarens is the **Caledonspoort Border Post** (closest town Butha-Buthe), situated 9km outside Fouriesburg on the Caledonspoort Road (see map). The main roads in Lesotho are tarred but can be closed at time due to snow or ice. Remember to take extra layers of warm clothes and blankets when visiting Lesotho as the weather can be extreme and changes quickly. Snow ploughs regularly clear the passes, but it is advised to check the weather and road conditions before starting your travels.

Also remember that you will need a valid passport (valid for 6 months after your departure date) and an unabridged birth certificate for South-African children aged 18 and under. You vehicle must be currently licensed and you need to provide your car ownership papers (Natis

- which you will have or you need to ask the bank to issue you with a letter allowing you to go over the border).

When planning your visit into Lesotho, it is advisable to check if any of the regulations have changed. You can visit the Afriski website or Facebook page for updates. www.afriski.net

Travelling in Lesotho is not measured in kilometres, but in hours! Hazards on the road are very different from driving in South Africa and respecting speed limits is a must.

AfriSki offers year-round adventures in the Maluti Mountains at 3222m above sea level. Both winter and summer seasons offer a host of activities for the adventurers who love the outdoors. Regular events and festivals are held and we suggest you follow Afriski's social

media platforms to keep abreast of the news. Also visit their website – www.afriski.net, for everything on offer. Directions from the Caledonspoort Border Post: follow the road until you see the blue "AfriSki 75km" sign, where you turn left. At the T-junction, turn left again. This is the road that will take you directly to AfriSki, 73km away.

Look out for the following landmarks: Muela hydropower station sign on your right; Mamohotsei pony trekking sign on your left; Liphofung cave sign on your left; Moteng Pass sign on your right; Moteng Pass top (2820m above sea level); Oxbow Lodge on your right; Mahlasela pass Top (3222m above sea level) sign on your left and finally the **AfriSki** entrance on your right.

Katse Dam

The **Katse Dam** is the second largest double-curvature arch reservoir dam in Africa. At 1993m above sea level, it is the highest dam in Africa and is surrounded by magnificent scenery. Owned by the Kingdom of Lesotho, it is over 50km long, has a surface of 3580 hectares and can hold 2 billion cubic meters of water! Due to the engineering feat of the **Lesotho Highlands Water Scheme** project, the Katse Dam supplies water to the Vaal

River system in South Africa by a series of tunnels stretching 82km between the dam and the Ash River outfall outside Clarens, while generating hydroelectricity for Lesotho.

Should you decide to stay overnight at the dam, the only option is the **Katse Lodge** (+266 2291 0202) which offers comfortable accommodation with friendly staff. There is a guided tour which takes the visitors inside the dam wall itself where the workings of the dam are explained. The tour ends on the dam wall which offers excellent views. There are hiking trails in the area, a beautiful botanical garden in a natural setting overlooking the dam and excellent flyfishing in the rivers nearby. Boat rides are available based on sufficient passenger numbers.

Direction to Katse Dam from Caledonspoort Border Post: cross the border post and travel towards Butha-Buthe. Turn right at the T-junction/Leribe intersection, heading south on the Route A1. At Leribe you will see Katse Dam signposted to the left. Travel 70km over White Man's Pass to Ha Lejone and then further on towards Katse.

larens toward Bethlehem (R712)

Driving from Clarens toward Bethlehem you will see, on your left hand side, **Titanic Rock** guarding the entrance to the village. The name was proposed by a lady visitor to the area in 1912, the same year as the Titanic sank and the village of Clarens was founded.

The Ash River Outfall is 8km along the Bethlehem road and is one of the Lesotho Highlands Water Scheme's view point and a tribute to the engineering of this remarkable project (find more information in the Lesotho section).


Sol Plaatje Dam/Saulspoort Dam: This earth-filled type dam is located at the confluence of the Ash and Liebenbergsvlei Rivers, as you approach Bethlehem, and was established in 1968 serving mainly as

a municipal and domestic water supply. The reservoir receives water for the Lesotho Highlands Water Project via the Ash River. Originally known as Saulspoort Dam, it was officially renamed on 1st April 2005 after a bus disaster which took place in the early hours of 1st May 2003, where 51 passengers en-route to a Workers Day rally, were drowned. 41 of the workers were employees of the Sol Plaatje Municipality (Kimberley).

larens toward Sterkfontein Dam (R712)

As you turn right from Clarens onto the R712, you will pass the entrance to the Clarens Golf & Leisure Estate on the left. Paraffin Kop, the round hill on your right is so named because the residents of yore claimed to be able to detect a paraffin odour emanating from the hill at certain times.





As you get close to Golden Gate **Highlands National** Park, you will notice **Kiara Lodge** (058 255 0140), a popular timeshare resort also open to the public on the right. Take a hike up Dassie Rock to see an excellent example of rock art, or stop at Leap Adventures (068 062 4947) for many outdoor activities. For the



The Golden Gate Highlands National Park (058 255 1000) is deservedly the area's main tourist attraction. Just 20km from Clarens, it is run and administered by SANPARKS. The government bought the Van Reenen family farm, Golden Gate, in 1962 and handed the land over to the National Parks Board. Between 1963 and today, the park has been increased from 4.792ha to its present 11.630ha, and borders Qwa-Qwa and Lesotho.

The drive to and through **Golden Gate Highlands National Park** is tarred and,
as an arterial route to Harrismith, there is
no entrance fee to drive through the park. **Golden Gate Highlands National Park**offers a well laid-out and serviced



camping and caravanning site, plus chalets for visitors. There is a picnic and braai area for day visitors (key available at the office), as well as a filling station and curio shop. Please note that there are no ATM facilities available. We urge the visitors using the park facilities to pay the small administrative fee at the main office. At time of print, the Dinosaur Museum was still under construction. But with the many dinosaur artefacts in the region, this will soon become a very interesting place to visit.

A short distance pass the Museum, there are two loop-roads into the highlands of the park (right & left and both one-way). Both routes take approximately 30 minutes, are tarred and suitable for all types of vehicle. Both loops offer spectacular views and numerous photo

opportunities. About 3km along the Oribi Loop on the left hand side is the path to the lookout point for the Vulture Restaurant, where a bird hide has been erected allowing you to watch the Cape Vulture and Bearded Vulture scavenging the carcasses that are regularly placed there. The road through Golden Gate will take you to **Phuthaditjaba** and then **Harrismith**. Once past the dam wall turn right onto the R74 (towards Bergville), to get to **Sterkfontein Dam**. The entrance to the **Sterkfontein Dam Nature Reserve** is a few kilometres down this road to your right

tributary of the Wilge River), it is part of the Tugela-Vaal River project and the Drakensberg Pumped Storage Scheme. The dam wall is 93m high (second highest in the country) and can be viewed from the R712 between Phutaditjhaba and the R74 turn off.

The 3rd largest dam in South Africa, it has a capacity if 2.616.950 cubic meters and stretches over a surface area of 67km2. Surrounding the dam is **Sterkfontein**

Dam Nature Reserve, which is home to more than 200 species of birds, including the endangered Cape Vulture and Bearded

STERKFONTEIN DAM

With crystal clear waters, prevailing winds and in the middle of a nature reserve, no wonder **Sterkfontein Dam** is a sought after destination in the Eastern Free State.

Built in 1980 on the Nuwejaarspruit (a



larens to Fouriesburg (R711)

The 35km trip on the R711 from Clarens to Fouriesburg is probably one of the most scenic roads in the country, and is considered amongst the top 10 runs for motorcyclists. The road is filled with breath-taking views of sandstone outcrops and valleys that are a photographer's delight.

There are excellent examples of Bushman art on the **Schaapplaats Farm.** To get to Schaapplaats, turn right onto the Golden Gate road as you exit town and then right again onto the Fouriesburg road (about 100m). Travel for 1.3km and then turn left on the **\$1028**. Schaapplaats is 6km from the turnoff. There is a R50 entry fee per person, which goes towards the rural conservancy. Viewing by appointment only, call Sarah on 063 969 2657.



Surrender Hill commemorates where the Free State Boer Commandos surrendered to British troops on 31st July 1900, and was proclaimed a National Monument in 1986 and has recently been revamped, with a new plaque erected (in resin so it won't be stolen!). In July 1900 a large part of the Free State armed forces were surrounded by British troops in the Brandwater Basin, Gen CR De Wet and about 2000 men escaped over Slabbert's Nek. In the basin, under Chief Comdt Marthinus Prinsloo's command, on 31st July, they agreed to surrender. More than 4300 Boers laid down their arms, at Surrender Hill, where the British destroyed the captured arms and

ammunition. The bare

patches caused by the fire and exploding ammunition serve as a reminder of one of the most serious setbacks suffered by the Boers during the Anglo-Boer War (1899-1902). The prisoners of war were then walked to Theunissen (some 200km away) where they were taken by train to Bloemfontein,



Kimmberley and Cape Town before being sent to prison camps in St Helena.



About 18km along the Fouriesburg road, look for the \$1356, a tarred road to the left which follows the Caledon River, the area's border between Lesotho and South Africa. The road affords a fascinating glimpse of Basotho culture. Turn around once you reach the gravel and head back up the road. Down the hill past Oranje Gasteplaas you will find a dirt road to your left. This is the best route to visit Queen Victoria. One of the 20 largest freestanding sandstone formations in the Free State, the good Queen is situated on the farm Lesoba. Although hard to discern from the main road, on closer inspection of the profile, the formation looks like the silhouette of the good lady herself!

Who would have thought that you can go wine tasting in the Free State? As you head toward Fouriesburg, lookout for the **\$325** and the sign "Mile High Vineyards",

whose owners John and Trish are successfully producing excellent wine

from their vineyard under the label **Bald Ibis Wines**. Pop in and stock up your cellar or treat yourself to a meal at the **Mile High Vineyards Restaurant**. Call 072 142 3183 for tasting times and bookings.

At the same turnoff is the **Arpa Adventure Farm**, where the annual **Cluny Animal Trust Polar Bear Plunge** is held. The dam, with

its row of trees submerged through to middle of it, is possibly one of the most photographed dams in the Eastern Free State. The owners even built a special gate from the main road allowing photographers easy access to the vantage points.

As you climb the hill towards Fouriesburg, you will notice **Destiny Castle** atop a sandstone mountain in the distance. This real-life medieval castle was built in modern days and offers spectacular 360 degrees views over the Maluti Mountains. If you ever wanted to feel like a princess or a knight in shining armour, **Destiny Castle** is for you. Guided tours or self-drive tours (4x4 only) can be booked with Liz on 084 512 5030

When you see **Jenlees Country Shop** on your left (you won't miss it!), you will have reached Fouriesburg.



Fouriesburg is a low-key agricultural village with beautiful sandstone buildings and old-world courtesy. Of particular interest are the NG Kerk which was inaugurated in 1893, the Town Hall, the Intermediary School and the old Magistrates Court. Fouriesburg boasts a hotel and many guesthouses, pubs, restaurants as well as gift shops for those important keepsakes.

From Fouriesburg, you can easily access the towns of **Ficksburg**, **Rosendal**,

Clocolan and Ladybrand.

An 8km drive will bring you to the **Caledonspoort Border Post**, the closest access point into Lesotho from Clarens, and the quickest route to **AfriSki** and **Katse Dam** (you will find all necessary information to cross the border post in the Lesotho section of this guide).

ouriesburg to Ladybrand (R26)

The scenery on the R26 to **Ladybrand** is magnificent, and although the road is not in the best condition, it is well worth the drive. Be aware that this is an arterial route to Bloemfontein and the truck traffic can be heavy.

Ionia Cherry Farm, on the right hand side, consists of 5 farms and has over

planted, as well as peach and plum trees. Stop for a snack and browse their mouth-watering array of homemade cherry products available throughout the year. Over cherry season they host popular cherry tours and picnics. Ionia Cherry Farm is also home to the now famous Cherry Crop Celebration hosted on the

On the way to Ficksburg, you will find **Sandstone Estates** on the left hand side. A large commercial agricultural enterprise, Sandstone Estates is also home to the Sandstone Heritage Trust. Started in the mid-1990s, the Trust boasts a large collection of steams trains, agricultural machinery from yesteryears and vintage military vehicle that have all


been restored on the farm and are in

Shortly before the **Ficksburg** turnoff you will find the R70 on your right hand side. This will lead you to the quaint village of Rosendal, with its galleries, restaurants and village-life atmosphere that has put this 'dorpie' on the map.

The **Gumtree** turnoff is approximately 15km past **Ficksburg**. This railway siding is home to the tallest sandstone building

> in the country. The mill used to be the hub of this once thriving area, but is now abandoned. Just the shell of the building remains as a reminder of a more prosperous time, and is a photographer's dream.

The typical Victorian-style manor was built by Charles Newberry at the end of the 19th century. What was originally a single storey farm cottage became a 20 roomed manor crafted from local sandstone and hosted the likes of Lord Milner, the Duke of Westminster, President Steyn and Rudyard Kipling. It is rightfully known as the architectural jewel of the Eastern Free State. An upmarket guesthouse for many vears, it is now under renovations

and unfortunately not open to the public at this stage.

Constantia Cherry Farm Stall can be found 2km before the **Clocolan** turnoff. It has grown from just a retail point for fresh cherries during the season to a must-see attraction on the **Maloti Route**. This shopper and foodie haven has a tempting range of exclusive cherry products, gifts, clothing and furnishing as well as lovely coffee shop. During the cherry season they offer farm tours and numerous activities. Call 082 304 7043 or visit their

website www.constantiafarmstall.co.za As the journey continues towards **Ladybrand**, you will find **The Cabin Farm** stall just 3km after the **Clocolan** turn off. The quaint sandstone building hosts a lovely coffee shop, a deli and offers local arts and crafts. Call 060 525 6155 for bookings and information.

From **Ladybrand** you can pick up the N8 to the **Maseru Border Post**, or carry on towards **Bloemfontein**.

t an altitude of 1850m, Clarens is the highest habitable village in the Free State and the 3rd highest in South Africa.

In 1911, the farms 'Lelieshoek' and 'Naauwpoort' were sold to a company wishing to establish a village in the area. The farms were divided into erven and sold at £50.00 each. A commission was appointed in 1912 to finalise the negotiations for the village. Since its humble beginnings 110 years ago, Clarens has become a prime tourist destination in the Free State and is now known as 'The Jewel of the Free State'. It is commonly known that Clarens got its name in commemoration to Paul Kruger who spent his last days in exile in the village of Clarens, Switzerland. However, this is a point of debate amongst local historians, and the truth is uncertain!



Dutch Reformed Church

but it was in that year that the first wood and iron church was built on the corner of Main & Naude Streets (now Rosewood Corner guesthouse). The large sandstone church that visitors now admire was built in 1940/1, with the cornerstone being unveiled by Ds JJ Le Roux on 24th February 1940. Interestingly, the church tower was originally capped by a Swiss-style 'onion' dome, but was later replaced by the clock tower you see today as many felt that the dome made the church look like a mosque!

The Anglican Church

Although the first Anglican community was established in 1885, the present church was built in 1936 and serves both the Anglican and Methodist communities.

428 Berg Street

This is possibly the oldest house in Clarens, with the original dwelling having been built in 1895.

The Post House

Now the location of a popular local restaurant, it was built in 1926 and soon became the central meeting place for the village. Both the post office and telephone exchange were run from the building. The post office was featured in the local 1980's movie, The Angel, The Bicycle and the Chinaman's Finger, which was directed by Katinka Heyns.

Blacksmith Cottage

Situated on the corner of Berg & Cilliers Streets and built in the early 1900's.

Horeb Butchery, General Dealer & Bottle Store

Locally known as Riempies (after the owner) are the buildings at the entrance of town where the filling station is situated. They have a long history with the original building and lean-too being used as the local Blacksmiths.

The Wilson Mosea Park

Also known as Market Square, and originally called President Square until the name was changed to Wilson Mosea Park in honour of a long serving Municipal worker. There had always been an open area in the centre of the village, but it wasn't until 1961 that the village council agreed to, and designed the Square. The monument which commemorated the fallen of the Battle of Naauwpoortnek (where a commando led by Paul Kruger in 1865 lost 5 men to Basotho warriors), that originally stood on the farm Ararat and was initially unveiled on 16th December 1895, was moved to the square and unveiled by the State President CR Swart in 1962 as a highlight of the Silver Jubilee of Clarens. Also on the Square is a plaque commemorating the construction of the tunnel for the Lesotho Highlands Water Project. In 2012, the Square was host to many festivities commemorating Clarens' centenary.





ur area is fast becoming a major centre for extreme sporting activities. Abseil from towering sandstone overhangs; book an Enduro adventure or take a day to yourself exploring the MTB trails that criss-cross the region. Theses exciting adventures are great for individuals, groups or team building exercises. Contact our local experts to plan your day of adventure.

For those fit enough, climbing the iconic **Mount Horeb** is considered one of the highlight activities in the region. You can access the hiking trail to the foothills through the Clarens Golf Estate. Unfortunately at this stage only people staying on the Clarens Golf Estate are allowed. Remember that the trail is on private property. No indemnity is given for climbers who take the challenge.

What is often mistaken for a drive-in screen on Horeb is actually a radio relay station for the Clarens police. As local legend has it, the smiley face was added by a local 'skollie' who shall not be named!

The Clarens Parkrun was started on 30th

March 2019 by a group of volunteers and happens every Saturday morning at 8.00am. It is a free 5km run/walk, where all are welcome (even well socialised dogs on a leash) that starts and finishes on the corner of Market & Church streets (visit their Facebook page - @Clarensparkrun for more information).

If you don't feel like adventuring on your own, you can book a guided hike in and around Clarens with **The Clarens Experience** (Nico Els 071 107 7351), or an educational tour with **Clarens Educational Tours** (Charl Wessels 083 636 0219).

Most shops in Clarens are situated around the village square and along Main Street. There are numerous restaurants, delis and eateries, gift and speciality shops to suit the most avid shoppers. Although it is beyond the scope and space of this guide to give a description of all the businesses, here are a few that you should not miss.

A visit to the award-winning Clarens Brewery is a must! They offer tasters of their superb beers and ciders and have the perfect pairing menu to complement their brews. Coffee lovers will feel at home at the Highland Coffee Roastery. An extensive coffee menu and freshly roasted beans are available daily.

Clarens Rocks has a fascinating collection of crystals, minerals and jewellery, and is well worth a visit. For book lovers, a browse around **Bibliophile** (312 Church Street) is a rare treat. They boast a wide selection of fascinating titles at very reasonable prices.

Fun Activities

Because not everyone is 'extreme', the area

also offers slower-paced pastimes for those who prefer a leisurely day. There are hikes, rambles, horse riding and cycling throughout our area. Try your hand at archery (Clarens Xtreme, Leap Adventures), or test your marksmanship with an afternoon of paintball (Clarens **Xtreme**, **Leap Adventures**), and for the more daring wall climbing (Clarens Xtreme), rock climbing (Leap Adventures) or taking a ride on a zip line are a must (Clarens Xtreme, Rebellie Mountain **Lodge).** A guad bike tour is the ideal way to see the surrounds (Clarens Xtreme, Leap Adventures, Rebellie Mountain Lodge -0825739021).

Abseiling - For those with no fear of heights, the area is perfect for abseiling. Contact Clarens Xtreme (058 256 1260 – www.clarensxtreme.co.za) or Leap Adventures (068 062 4947) for details of packages. Another way to explore the region

is from the sky! Book a Hot Air Balloon scenic trip and fly over our majestic mountains early morning. This is an amazing experience, definitely worth adding to your bucket list. Hot Air Ballooning SA (082 748 1558 - www.hotairballooningsa.co.za)







fter the ongoing skirmishes of the late 1800's were subdued and Eastern borders were tamed, an increasing number of people settled in the area. Although both Ficksburg and Bethlehem were relatively close (a day's ride), many of the residents lived between the two. In 1891 it was decided to establish a town to service the new settlers. Amongst the reasons given were the bad state of the route between Ficksburg and Bethlehem, the lack of solid bridges over rivers, the need

for the local community to have their own church, and the need of services and shops to the residents.

It was eventually decided to negotiate with Mr Christoffel Fourie (also known as Rooi Stoffel, after whom Fouriesburg is reputedly named), to buy his 146 morgan farm 'Grootfoontein'. Rooi Stoffel retained 82 morgan which renamed 'Restant' in October of 1891. At an auction, the stands were sold for the equivalent of R30.00 to R40.00 Stands were kept small at 750sqm to discourage residents from keeping livestock or growing their own crops, necessitating support of the local farmer. The new town was recognised by the Volksraad on the 1st June 1893. In 1894, the

first town council was established to run the village. Not much is known about these early days as many of the records were destroyed by the British forces that entered the town in 1900. Fouriesburg took its leap into modernity in 1954 when electric street lights were switched on for the first time (18 years before Clarens!). As a temporary seat of the Orange Free State Government during the Anglo Boer War, Fouriesburg was nearly completely destroyed during heavy fighting in the region. Thank goodness it survived!

he NG Kerk – Brand Street – The church was built on the site of the graves of those who fought with Paul Kruger during the Basotho Wars. The cornerstone was laid in 1893 and the church was inaugurated in 1894. The blockhouse where Paul Kruger and his men camped can still be seen in the southwest side of the grounds.

The Town Hall – Martin Street - Situated across the road from the Municipal offices, the Town Hall is a beautiful example of the sandstone architecture that proliferates around town.

The Intermediary School – Steyn Street – Originally named 'Die Goewermentskool', the building was first used in 1903.

Saint Mary's Church Methodist Church

– This beautiful old sandstone church was built in 1911 and is now home to the Fouriesburg United Church serving the residents of the town.

The Old Magistrates Building – The original building seen from Reitz Street was built in 1936 and is an interesting example of the architectural style of the period.

Die Ou Pastorie – corner Heyns & Noorder Streets – Built in 1896 and considered one of the most

attractive sandstone dwellings in the town. Die Ou Pastorie nowadays is not only a home, but also hosts a lovely guesthouse.

The President Steyn House – corner of Du Preez & Robertson Streets – This was the home of the President of the Orange Free State Republic, Marthinus Theunis Steyn, during the Anglo-Boer War. During the second Anglo-Boer War, Fouriesburg became Capital of the Orange Free State, when President Steyn had to flee Bloemfontein that was then occupied by the British Forces and the Boer Forces established their headquarters in the town. The house is now a private residence.

Fouriesburg Graveyard – The history in the area can be discerned through the local graveyard and Fouriesburg's cemetery is no exception. Many of the town's leaders are buried here. The earliest grave is that of JC Van Den Berg 1818-1896.

Destiny Castle – The castle started to be built in the seventies and was finished by the current owner some thirty years later. It has been extensively remodelled since. It can only be reached with a 4x4 vehicle, either your own (following the guide) or via a tour arranged with Liz Lee (084 512 5030). The castle is built on top of a mountain with 360-degree views into Lesotho and over the Witteberge.



There are two routes – a 10km figure-ofeight route and a 30km loop, both with shortcut options. The route is quite difficult with a very though climb up to the mountainous summit. All venues charge a fee per rider, and it is advised to call ahead.

The Boulders Riding Academy (Mike – 082 856 7181) and Happy Days Farm (Steve – 082 412 9975) are the perfect venues for bikers, whether it is enduro, dual-purpose motorcycles or quad bikes.

The Union Trails are a network of trails on a 1200 hectare estate, consisting of natural and hand-crafted trails which make use of the terrain to provide different levels of difficulty. The trails offer all mountain bikers and enduro riders some incredible riding, mixing flowing single-track, technical sections, eye-watering descents and some steep ascents. The route is contained within the estate and takes riders past the awesome Destiny Castle. www.unionhouse.co.za

With the beautiful scenery, horse-riding is also a popular activity around Fouriesburg. Guided rides featuring 1 to 4 hour trips, sundowners and moonlight rides are available from **De Hoop Adventures** – contact Fritz 072 371 9732 for bookings. **Old Mill's Drift Farm** (071 760 7333) and **Wynford Holiday Farm** (058 223 0274) also offer horse and pony rides.

Meiringskloof Nature Park (058 223 0067 - www.meiringskloof.co.za) has numerous hikes and walks, including The Fouriesburg Water Tunnels where Boer women and children hid during the Anglo Boer War. But this is quite a technical hike as there is a steep chain ladder to climb up. Alternatively, access to the Town Dam and the Water Tunnels can be gained through the locked gate at the Farmers Association Sales Yard. It is off road and only accessible with 4x4 vehicles. The key is available at the Di Plaasstoep (there is a R100 deposit fee, which will be refunded when the key is returned). This is a conservation and heritage site, and visitors are requested not to make any fires, remove plants or wildlife, and make sure they do not litter. Fishing is permitted at the Town Dam, and is strictly on a catch and release basis.

For the enthusiast hikers, there are many options around Fouriesburg. **Affi-Lande** (084 838 4110), **Di Plaaswerf** (082 927 6712), **Lesoba Guest Farm** (072 660

0840), Oranje Guest Farm (084 712 0427), Uithoek Nature Park (062 505 6854) and Welgelegen Cherry Farm (072 075 0760), all have numerous hiking trails of all levels. But if you are also a keen historian, then take a hike at Camelroc Guest Farm to view the rock art or Mafube Mountain Retreat (084 668 4499) for dinosaur footprints.

There are also numerous 4x4 routes of different levels in the area. Camelroc Guest Farm (difficult), Di Plaaswerf (easy to difficult), Lesoba Guest Farm (difficult), and Uithoek Nature Park are some the options available. Experienced 4x4 drivers can also book a guided drive with De Hoop Adventures (Fritz 072 371 9732)

If you want to enjoy a game of squash, the

local courts are managed by Gert Venter. Call him on 072 445 4159 to book.

Fouriesburg is in the heart of the cherry growing area, with September being the flowering season and mid-October to early December being the harvesting season. Don't miss a visit to the local orchards. Farms offering cherry tours and products are:





ituated 43km north of Ficksburg on the Senekal road, the Rosendal area first became known for farming, with the town being founded in 1908 and declared a Municipality in 1914. This followed a request from local farmers for a church and a market place that was within reasonable distance of their farms. The widow of Philip Botha donated the farm on which the town was founded, and she was asked to choose a name for it. She and her young son Hansie came up with two suggestions: Leliefontein and Rosendal. The later ('valley of roses') was eventually agreed upon.

A church, a bank, a post office, a school and a hotel were built, but because of its isolation and no railway, it never became the large town intended.

Post lockdown this small Free State farming town, with cattle and horses roaming the streets, started flourishing and numerous new accommodation establishments, eateries and galleries opened.

Today, **Rosendal** is still more of a village with open spaces and spectacular scenery. It has a small community of permanent residents – artists and business owners, as well as weekenders and holiday makers who have lovingly restored the old sandstone buildings, but also built quality newly designed houses and tiny homes.

The Post office, the Bank and the Old schoolmaster's house, amongst others, have been beautifully renovated and are now holiday rentals.

osendal NG Kerk: The first church services were held in the local blacksmith's workshop, and by 1913, the Rosendal community's desire to have a church of their own became stronger. The cornerstone was laid on 8th July 1914. The First World War slowed t h e construction and the church was only

completed in 1916. (501 Van Niekerk Street).

A walk around town (everything is within walking distance in Rosendal!) is the best way to discover the numerous historical buildings it has to offer, the views over the Witteberge and the peace and quiet of this charming dorpie. The avid birders can book a birding tour at Rosendal Handelshuis (082 878 3139), and for the children a "milk a cow by hand" experience is a must! (Rosendal Handelshuis 082 878 3139).

For the more adventurous, there are many outdoor activities such as hiking, mountain biking, horse riding or a sunset at the Holkrans. Visit the Rosendal Outdoor Hub (33 Neethling Street) or contact them on 083 294 5260 to book.

A Brief History



he area between Ficksburg and Ladybrand has been witness to many historical battles, from the Difquane Wars through to the Anglo-Boer Wars, and is steeped not only in military history, but also rich in San rock art and fossils.

Ficksburg was named after the Boer General, General Fick, who proclaimed the town in 1867 to act as a buffer zone between the then Orange Free State and Basotholand. By 1883 it had established itself as a trading area and an influx of British traders supplied everything from agricultural equipment to dresses. Ficksburg today boasts a cosmopolitan population of about 84.000 people. Ficksburg is the only town in South Africa where the border post is part of the town. The main source of income is derived from

agriculture with cherries and asparagus being the two crops

which have put Ficksburg firmly on the map.

Clocolan is situated 34km from Ficksburg. The town was established in 1906 on the farms Reinzi and Herold. The town grew out of the need for schools, churches and business services for the surrounding farming community. It obtained municipal status on 18th July 1910. The Eastern Free State cherry

industry originated in the Clocolan district where the first trees were planted by Henry Pickstone in 1904 on the farm Platkop. The name Clocolan is derived from the South Sotho word Hlohlowane, meaning 'stand up and fight', which refers to an altercation between two tribes which took place many years before.

Ladybrand was founded in 1867 and named after Lady Catharina Brand, the mother of President Brand, then President of the Orange Free State Colony. Ladybrand was initially established as a frontier post to defend the conquered territory from their neighbours. Today, it is a cosmopolitan town serving as a trade and business centre on the border of Lesotho, as well as being the administrative centre of the Mantsopa District Municipality.

Places of Interest

icksburg Museum (General Fick Museum) is a museum which largely details the life of Gen. Fick and, amongst other exhibits, the history of the town's cherry industry. The building was completed in 1893, is a National Monument and is listed as a Provincial Heritage Site. (23 Vootrekker Street).

Ficksburg Town Hall: The cornerstone of the building was laid on 21st July 1897 by

Mr M I Fourie. the then Chairm an of the Municip ality. It w a s complet before t h e outhrea k of the Anglo-Boer War and



Ficksburg NG Kerk: Ds JD Kestell was confirmed as the community's new minister in 1903. He had served as chaplain to General C J de Wet during the Anglo-Boer War. I was decided to build this Romanesque styled church to honour the Boers who had died in the conflict. The site had to be excavated to a depth of 4 meters to reach bedrock, but remarkably it only took 3 years to complete the

building. It was consecrated on 12th April 1907 and is an example of the community spirit of the time. Every member of the congregation worked towards raising funds for the project. The women undertook to supply the impressive organ and lights for the building, the young people collected for the bell and the clock which was made by J Smith & Sons of

Gumtree, a small settlement 20km from Ficksburg, has the tallest sandstone structure in the world. The mill which used to be the hub of this once thriving district is no longer operative, but the shell of the magnificent building remains.

ue to the increasing movement of people between Winburg and Harrismith after the Boers had settled in the area, a request was made to establish a town to service the growing population. Permission was granted by president Snyman, and so Bethlehem was founded. Messrs Francois Naude, Johannes Muller and Daniel Malan held a public auction on the farm Pretoriuskloof in 1864 and 120 stands with prices ranging from £10 to £21 were sold.

Because of Bethlehem's location on the main route between Natal and the Kimberley diamond fields, the growth of the new town was rapid. By the time the first railway line reached Bethlehem from the Cape in 1890, the town boasted a population of over 15.247 souls. In 1900 President Steyn moved the Free State Government to Bethlehem

Bethlehem sits in a fertile valley at the very northern tip of the Maluti mountain range, close to the towns of Clarens, Fouriesburg and Paul Roux, and is the commercial heart of the region that is based on crop and livestock farming as well as nature and outdoor activities focused on tourism. The area around Bethlehem is South Africa's bread basket, with about 60% of the country's wheat production grown in the

region.

Bethlehem is known as 'The Bread Basket' after the original Hebrew meaning of the word Bethlehem 'house of bread'. It is so called because the town and surroundings boast fertile lands where wheat grows in abundance. It lies at an altitude of 1700 meter and has a cool climate with an average annual temperature of around 24 degrees C, but cold and sunny winters. For those who appreciate history and architecture, Bethlehem features numerous Victorian sandstone buildings that can be viewed on a Sandstone Walking Tour, as well as cemeteries dating from the Anglo-Boer War.

or those with a love for things from yesteryear, there are numerous Heritage sites and buildings around Bethlehem that are well worth a visit.

Pretoriuskloof Bird Sanctuary: Located on the bank of the Jordaan River that runs through the centre of town. The Pretoriuskloof Bird Sanctuary is named after the original farm that Bethlehem was established on. Shady trees provide an ideal spot for a picnic.

The Bethlehem Museum: The museum is one of cultural history and is housed in the Old Nazareth Mission Church on Muller Street. The church was originally built in 1906 and is both architecturally and aesthetically pleasing. The museum contains a number of historical items including an old steam train which is housed on the grounds. Children will be fascinated learning more about this method of travel their great grandparents used in 'days of yore'. The museum represents the town's history and culture as seen by the exhibits of farming implements and period furniture that depict the lifestyle of former residents of town. Military historians will be impresses with the collection of war memorabilia. It is advisable to call before hand as the museum is only open at selected times, 7 Muller Street - 058 303 5076, For those interested in history, the Anglo-Boer War British Soldiers Cemetery is a must. Situated at the start of Muller Street it boasts tombs of soldiers and volunteers fallen in the region during the Anglo-Boer War (1899-1902).

Lionsrock Big Cat Sanctuary: Lionsrock is situated on a 1200 hectares park 18km outside Bethlehem (GPS Coordinates 28*13'11.4"S - 28*27'46.6" E). As a Four Paws big cat sanctuary, it provides a lifelong home for big cats previously kept in inadequate conditions in zoos, circuses or in private captivity. The habitats constructed for the predators offer the highest standards, including large areas for family groups, facilitation of natural behaviour, through enrichment, excellent medical care and top security standards of enclosures. All hunting, trading or breeding of wild animals is strictly prohibited. Male lions are vasectomised as lions raised in captivity cannot be released into the wild. Lionsrock is also home to wildebeest, springbok, eland, zebras, ostriches, and a wide variety of bird species. There is also accommodation, a restaurant and a bar at the lodge. Wolhutterskop Nature & Game Reserve: Situated on the R26, 6km towards Fouriesburg, the reserve was developed to conserve a small part of the Eastern Free State's grassland with its sandstone ridges, and to bring in the game that used to occur there naturally, including springbok, eland, impala, black wildebeest and blesbuck. Apart from the larger game, the reserve offers a wide range of species, including the water mongoose, cape clawless otter, caracal and large-spotted genet. Today Wolhutterskop Game & Nature Reserve is a retreat where visitors can experience this part of the Eastern Free State as it once was. There are three circular routes through the reserve for day drives. Visitors can also hike, mountain bike or take a led horse trail. For birders, about 120 species have been identified, including the signature bird of Africa, the fish eagle, and plenty water birds on the Baber Bay Dam in the reserve, which originally supplied Bethlehem with water. For those interest in plants and trees, the reserve offers a wide range, including the jackal berry tree, the white olive tree and grass aloe. Contact: 058 303 5732. Entry fee applies.

About Paul Roux

he quaint village of Paul Roux is situated on the N5 route between Bethlehem and Senekal. It is the birthplace of former President P.W Botha who was born there on 12th January 1916.

Established as a coach station between Winburg and Harrismith in 1909, it was named after Reverend Paul Roux from the Dutch Reformed Church.

Plots were originally sold in 1910 for a shilling each! Although homesteads were immediately built, Paul Roux had no official church and services were held on the banks of the Sand River

under the willow trees. A sandstone church was finally built in 1914 and inaugurated in October 1917.

Paul Roux' history dates back to the Jurassic period and dinosaur footprints can be seen on a large block of sandstone at Uniondale Farm. Take a hike on the Holhoek Hiking Trail to visit caves and admire bushman paintings.

The Paul Roux Conservancy manages and protects the environment in and around town, especially The Rooidam where wetlands are a birder's paradise. Dont' miss the yearly Ghost Walk which is great fun for the whole family.





he Postal Tree – corner of Van Rooyen & Market Streets. In yesteryears, the residents' post was left under this tree by the postal coach. To this day, the tree may not be cut or damaged in any way.

National Bank – Voortrekker Street. The old bank building used to host church services on the veranda before the church was built. Today it is a private dwelling.

Rosenhof Guest Lodge – 18 Market Street . This lovely sandstone building

has been the town's hotel since it was built in 1927.

Uniondale Game Farm: Situated 8km outside the town of Paul Roux, Uniondale Game Farm is the perfect day outing. Day visitors can enjoy a braai or a picnic at the numerous spots on the farm, or go for a game drive on the farm (booking essential). Uniondale Game Farm is also home to dinosaur footprints that can be viewed when visiting. Contact: 083 998 4493 - www.uniondalefarm.co.za
